

Communion - We will be offering communion in both kinds (bread and wine) We have decided not to allow people to intinct (dip) any consecrated wafers into wine. We will simply be offering the opportunity for those who wish to to drink from the chalice (communion cup) in the normal way. Please come up for communion as normal, receive the bread and return to your place if you do not wish to drink from the chalice.

If you would prefer to receive a prayer of blessing, please do come forward and hold your hands by your side, or carry a service sheet, to indicate this to the priest.

If you are unable to come forward to receive communion, please advise a steward or member of clergy and communion will be brought to you in your place.

Gluten free wafers are available; please indicate to the priest as you go up to receive communion if this is your preference.

PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

A minister introduces the confession

When the Lord comes, he will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness, and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Therefore in the light of Christ let us confess our sins.

AII Father eternal, giver of light and grace, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour, in what we have thought, in what we have said and done, through ignorance, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We have wounded your love and marred your image in us. We are sorry and ashamed, and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past; and lead us out from darkness to walk as children of light. Amen.

The Priest says the **ABSOLUTION**, proclaiming God's forgiveness, using these or other words

THE COLLECT

The Priest introduces a period of silent prayer and then says the prayer of the day.

Eternal God, as Mary waited for the birth of your Son, so we wait for his coming in glory; bring us through the birth pangs of this present age to see, with her, our great salvation in Jesus Christ our Lord.

All sit for the reading.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

READING: Isaiah 7.10-16 Read by Norman Vaughton

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

The LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying, Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test. Then Isaiah said: 'Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel. He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

All stand. During the **HYMN** (HON 249) please turn to face the Gospel as it is processed into the congregation. Remain standing for the Gospel Reading

Hark, the glad sound! the Saviour comes, the Saviour promised long: let ev'ry heart prepare a throne, and ev'ry voice a song.

He comes, the pris'ners to release in Satan's bondage held; the gates of brass before him burst, the iron fetters yield. He comes, the broken heart to bind, the bleeding soul to cure, and with the treasures of his grace to bless the humble poor.

Our glad hosanna, Prince of Peace, thy welcome shall proclaim; and heav'n's eternal arches ring with thy beloved name.

GOSPEL: Matthew 1.18-25

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Alleluia ...

The birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel',

which means, 'God is with us.'

When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

This is the gospel of the Lord. Alleluia...

The Gospel procession returns to the altar. Please sit at the invitation of the preacher.

GIVING OF COMMUNION

The Priest invites the people to receive communion.

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

All Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Please come forward to receive communion if you wish. If you would prefer not to receive communion, you are warmly encouraged to come forward for a prayer of blessing; please hold your hands by your side or carry a service sheet so the Priest knows you'd like a prayer rather than communion.

Communion is offered in both kinds, bread and wine, but if you'd prefer to take a consecrated wafer and not receive from the communion cup, then you're welcome to do so. Please refrain from drinking the consecrated wine if you have any cold or flu symptoms or are feeling unwell.

COMMUNION HYMN

Walking with the Word

You may remember Mother Kirstine talking to us on 'Bible Sunday' a few weeks ago about the need to become more familiar with the Bible. We want to provide more opportunities to study and use the Bible together as 'the Body of Christ' and individually as 'pilgrims on the Way.' Jesus is called 'the Word' in St John's Gospel and the Bible is often described as 'the Word of God.' Walking with the Word is a good title for a Bible Study course where our aim is to know what's in the Bible, why it's there and how we are to live out what is in it. More importantly, how do we relate to the Jesus we read and hear about in the Bible? How does putting him at the centre of our lives make a difference?

It is not helpful to think of it as a rulebook (not that rules aren't important) but as more of a handbook or map and compass for our Christian journey – perhaps the most important of things for us to carry in our Christian rucksack. We are all on a journey 'home' to God and our life together and individually is about uncovering the reality (as Mother Julian of Norwich put it) that 'God made us, God loves us and God keeps us.' It is worth remembering however that even with a Map there are often different ways of getting to the same destination! We need to seek God in our life together as a Church and to seek God in our individual lives. There will be common reference points on the journey and times when we walk together surveying the same scenery and undergoing the same experience and there will be other times when our journey is deeply personal and unique to us. God calls us together and apart. The Bible can speak into all of this and often helps us to navigate life's challenges and to encourage a deeper trust in God.

With this in mind we want to spend time looking at what the Bible is and what it meant when the authors of its library of books wrote them and what the contents might mean for us now in the turbulent 21st century. One thing is for sure the Word of God has the power to change lives and the Bible is crammed full of examples!

It is important to say that you do not need any previous experience of studying the Bible in order to be part of Walking with the Word. It is also important to say that the sessions are 'stand alone,' so if you miss one no worries! There are resources available to go with the course and details of these will follow. If you are a tax payer, you are able to Gift Aid any donations made, which means we will receive **25% more than the donation amount**. So, for example, should you donate £10, the church will automatically receive an extra £2.50 via Gift Aid. The Gift Aid we receive really does make a big difference, so we would appreciate you signing up for this.
