**Communion** - We will be offering communion in both kinds (bread and wine) Please refrain from dipping consecrated wafers into the communion wine. Communion wine will be offered from a common cup in the normal way. Please receive the bread and then the wine, if you wish to, and return to your places.

If you would prefer to receive a prayer of blessing, come forward in the usual way carrying a service sheet with you, so we know you're asking for a blessing rather than communion.

If you are unable to come forward to receive communion, please advise a steward or member of clergy and communion will be brought to you in your place.

**Gluten free wafers are available;** please indicate to the priest as you go up to receive communion if this is your preference.

## **THE LITURGY OF THE WORD**

**READING:** *Genesis 2.15-17; 3.1-7*

*Read by Fran Blacklock*

A reading from the book of Genesis.

The LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the LORD God commanded the man, 'You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.'

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, 'Did God say, "You shall not eat from any tree in the garden"?' The woman said to the serpent, 'We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; but God said, "You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die."' But the serpent said to the woman, 'You will not die; for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.' So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

Then the devil left him, and suddenly angels came and waited on him.

*Communion is offered in both kinds, bread and wine, but if you'd prefer to take a consecrated wafer and not receive from the communion cup, then you're welcome to do so. Please refrain from drinking the consecrated wine if you have any cold or flu symptoms or are feeling unwell.*

### **This week - Living it out: Lifestyle as if creation matters**

Jesus says "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation" (Mark 16:15). Our mission includes all of God's creation, not just people. We could joke about how to preach to a goat or to a garden, but that would miss the point. This is about not only preaching with words, but about how we communicate Jesus' message in our relationships, attitudes and lifestyles. What is the good news for a rainforest that is being chopped down to feed our meat-hungry lifestyles? What is the good news for creatures that God lovingly made but are now being driven towards extinction? What is the good news for the world's climate systems as they become thrown off course by our polluting lifestyles?

I believe there is good news for all these situations, and it is found in Jesus. It is the good news that sinful, greedy, polluting human beings can be transformed inwardly in their relationship with God, and outwardly in their relationship with others and the planet. (p. 135 selected sentences).


