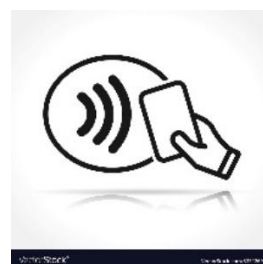
If you would prefer to receive a prayer of blessing, come forward in the usual way carrying a service sheet with you, so we know you're asking for a blessing rather than communion.

GATHERING

WELCOMING THE EASTER CANDLE

The choir and ministers gather at the back of the church. All stand and turn to face them. The Priest says

All Christ yesterday and today,
the beginning and the end,
Alpha and Omega,
all time belongs to him,
and all ages;
All **to him be glory and power,**
through every age and for ever.
Amen.

The flame of the Easter candle symbolizes the risen Christ as the light of the world and his presence in the midst of his people.

A minister brings in the lit Easter Candle and proclaims

All Alleluia. Christ is risen.
He is risen indeed. Alleluia.

The Priest says

This is the day when our Lord Jesus Christ was raised gloriously from the dead, crushing the power of sin and destroying the sting of death. Throughout the world Christians celebrate the mighty power of God as Christ calls us out of darkness to share in his marvellous light. May we, and all Christ's people, shine as lights in the world to the glory of God the Father.

The minister holding the Candle says

All The light of Christ.
Thanks be to God.

We are going to transform the bare wooden cross on the left hand side of church with flowers to celebrate Easter Day. Please follow the procession to the front of church, place your flower, offer a prayer of thanksgiving as you do so and return to your place down the side aisles.

All sing the **PROCESSIONAL HYMN** (HON 339), during which the Easter Candle leads the procession of choir and ministers to the front of church.

**Jesus Christ is risen today, Alleluia!
our triumphant holy day, Alleluia!
who did once upon the cross, Alleluia!
suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluia!**

**Hymns of praise then let us sing, Alleluia!
unto Christ, our heavenly King, Alleluia!
who endured the cross and grave, Alleluia!
sinners to redeem and save. Alleluia!**

**But the pains which he endured, Alleluia!
our salvation have procured, Alleluia!
now above the sky he's King, Alleluia!
where the angels ever sing. Alleluia!**

ACCLAMATION

Alleluia. Christ is risen.
All He is risen indeed. Alleluia.

Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ:
**All he has given us new life and hope
by raising Jesus from the dead.**

God has claimed us as his own:
All he has made us light to the world.

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

*The Easter candle is placed in a prominent position at the front of the church. A fanfare is played on the organ, whistles and bells are sounded, and then the **GLORIA IN EXCELSIS** is sung*

and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,

you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.**

THE COLLECT

The Priest introduces a period of silent prayer using these words

Let us pray that we may reign with the risen Christ in glory.

Silence is kept.

Lord of all life and power,
who through the mighty resurrection of your Son
overcame the old order of sin and death
to make all things new in him:
grant that we, being dead to sin
and alive to you in Jesus Christ,
may reign with him in glory;
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit
be praise and honour, glory and might,
now and in all eternity.

All Amen.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

All sit for the reading.

READING: Acts 10.34-43

Read by Rose Lucas

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with

him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

*All stand. During the **HYMN** (HON 623) please turn to face the Gospel as it is processed into the congregation. Remain standing for the Gospel Reading.*

GOSPEL READING: John 20.1-18

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Alleluia...

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.' Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went towards the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping?' She

You are invited to greet those near to you with an appropriate sign of peace.

GIVING OF COMMUNION

The Priest invites the people to receive communion, saying

All Alleluia. Christ our passover is sacrificed for us.
Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

All The body of Christ.
Amen.

All The blood of Christ.
Amen.

Please come forward to receive communion if you wish. If you would prefer not to receive communion, you are warmly encouraged to come forward for a prayer of blessing; please hold your hands by your side or carry a service sheet so the Priest knows you'd like a prayer rather than communion.

Communion is offered in both kinds, bread and wine, but if you'd prefer to take a consecrated wafer and not receive from the communion cup, then you're welcome to do so. Please refrain from drinking the consecrated wine if you have any cold or flu symptoms or are feeling unwell.

Finance Group: As a Parish we are facing significant financial challenges going forward (and that is even before the developing crisis in the middle east!) To help us to achieve this, we would like to re-form our Finance Group. The group meets 4 or 5 times a year. Church Aisle Roof Appeal: We would like to repair and protect the remainder of the north aisle roof as soon as possible. We have already had one third of the roof repaired very successfully. We have a quotation from the contractors who did the original third, and the offer of a significant contribution from an anonymous donor. However, due to the changes to the Listed Places of Worship Scheme where VAT was refundable, we are left with a shortfall of approximately £4000. We are appealing to members of our Christian family here in St John's who may be in a position to respond with donations of any size. We would very much like this work to go ahead as soon as possible to ensure the entire aisle roof is waterproofed and protected for the future.

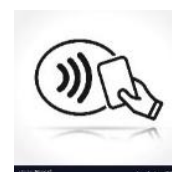

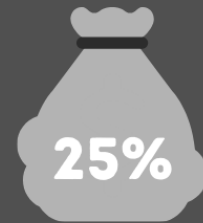
